ORIGINAL WRIT PETITION BATCH No IV (R)

Petitioner was Clerk in Seth Harcharan Das Girls Inter College, Hathras, district Aligarh. He was to attain the age of 58 years on 31.10.1992. Through G.O. dated 6.10.1990 option was given to the employees of the aided schools either to opt for retirement at the age of 58 years or at the age of 60 years. Petitioner gave option of retirement at the age of 58 years on 15.12.1990. Accordingly, petitioner was made to retire on 31.10.1992. Copy of the option is Annexure-1 to the writ petition. In para 5 of the writ petition, it is mentioned that immediately after retirement petitioner approached the respondents with the request that since age of superannuating was 60 years hence he should be allowed to work till 31.10.1994. It is stated in the same para that on 21.6.1993 College authorities issued no dues certificate to the petitioner. There is no allegation that any request for withdrawal of the option was made before 31.10.1992. Neither copies of alleged written requests made after the said date (as alleged in para 5 of the writ petition) have been annexed nor their dates have been given.

Petitioner has also annexed copy of G.O. dated 18.11.1991 as Annexure-3 to the writ petition and has stated that he was not aware of the said G.O.

Annexure-5 to the writ petition is a letter dated 6.9.1993 written by the Principal of the College to the petitioner. In the said letter it is mentioned that in reply to the earlier letter dated 28.8.1993 written by the Principal regarding submission of forms and documents for payment of pension, petitioner had mentioned that in the absence of gratuity retirement was not accepted. That appears to be first written communication by the petitioner to the Principal. It was made after about 10 months of actual retirement.

The main case of the petitioner is that by virtue of G.O. dated 18.11.1991 (Annexure-3 to the writ petition), age of retirement of non-teaching employees of aided schools again became 60 years, hence he was entitled to continue till 31.10.1994. The case of the petitioner that he was not aware of the said G.O. is not believable. No one can plead ignorance of law.

In any case the G.O. dated 18.11.1991 cannot be interpreted in the manner in which learned Counsel for the petitioner wanted it to be interpreted. It was mentioned in the said G.O. that those teachers and non-teaching employees who were appointed after the G.O. dated 6.10.1990 would automatically be held entitled to the new pension scheme and teachers would be required to give option at the time of appointment as to whether he/she would opt to retire at the age of 58 years or not. The petitioner has not exercised his option as per the G.O. for reasons best known to him.

Punctuation Used	Where in Passage	Rule (Why Used)
Comma after date	"Through G.O. dated 6.10.1990, option was given..."	Comma after an introductory phrase before the main sentence
Comma after "In para 5 of the writ petition"	"In para 5 of the writ petition, it is mentioned..."	Comma after an introductory/opening phrase
Comma after "In any case"	"In any case, the G.O. dated 18.11.1991..."	Comma after a transitional phrase that introduces a new point
Comma with parenthetical phrase	"In my opinion provision that age of retirement of non-teaching would be 60 years was made applicable only..."	"In my opinion" is an introductory parenthetical — should ideally have a comma after it (legal drafting sometimes omits it)

C. BRACKETS / PARENTHESES

Usage	Example	Rule
To add extra explanation inside a sentence	"(by the said G.O. dated 18.11.1991)"	Brackets enclose additional information that explains but is not essential to the main sentence. Remove the brackets and the sentence still makes sense.
"(as alleged in para 5 of the writ petition)"	Same sentence above	Writer clarifies the source/basis of a claim inside brackets
"(Annexure-3 to the writ petition)"	"copy of G.O. dated 18.11.1991 as Annexure-3 to the writ petition"	Legal reference placed in brackets to identify the document
"(or resume work)"	"continue to work (or resume work) till 60 years"	Alternative word/phrase added in brackets to cover both possibilities

D. HYPHEN

Usage	Example	Rule
Hyphen in compound expression	"non-teaching employees"	Hyphen joins two words that together form one describing term (compound modifier)

Golden Summary for Students:

- Comma = pause, separation of phrases, or after introductory words.
- Full stop = sentence is complete.
- Brackets = extra information, safely removable.
- Hyphen = two words acting as one describing word.
- Capital = name, title, place, or start of sentence.
