With a view to fostering reconciliation and exploring the possibility of an amicable settlement of the matrimonial dispute between the parties, this Court had, at an earlier stage, directed both sides to appear before the Mediation Centre attached to this Court on a specified date and time. Such a direction was issued in keeping with the settled judicial policy that matrimonial disputes, being sensitive in nature, ought to be resolved through dialogue and mutual understanding wherever feasible, rather than through prolonged litigation. The parties accordingly appeared before the Mediation Centre and participated in the proceedings in good faith. However, despite earnest efforts made by the learned Mediator and cooperation extended by both sides, the mediation proceedings did not culminate in a settlement, and the same were reported as unsuccessful.

In light of the failure of mediation, the matter has now been taken up for adjudication on merits. The present

petition has been filed by the petitioner-wife invoking the jurisdiction of this Court under Section 25 of the Code of Civil Procedure, seeking transfer of matrimonial proceedings initiated by the respondent-husband. The proceedings in question arise out of a petition filed under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, wherein the respondent-husband has sought restitution of conjugal rights. The said case is presently pending before the Family Court situated at a distant location from the place of residence of the petitioner-wife.

The principal ground urged by the petitioner-wife in support of the transfer petition is that she is facing considerable hardship in attending the proceedings at the present forum. It has been submitted that the petitioner is residing at her parental home, which is situated in another State, and the distance between the two places is substantial. The petitioner has further contended that she lacks independent financial resources and is unable to undertake frequent travel to attend court proceedings. Additionally, it has been emphasized that the petitioner does not have adequate support or escort to safely travel such long distances, thereby causing her serious inconvenience and prejudice.

On the other hand, the respondent-husband has opposed the transfer petition, contending that the proceedings have been validly instituted at the current forum and that no sufficient grounds exist for transferring the case. It is argued that the respondent would be inconvenienced if the case is transferred and that the petition is motivated by an intent to delay the proceedings.

Having heard the learned counsel appearing for the parties and upon perusal of the material available on

record, this Court is of the considered view that in matrimonial matters, the convenience of the wife is a significant factor that must be taken into account while deciding transfer petitions. Judicial precedents have consistently held that where the wife is unable to conveniently attend proceedings at a distant forum, and where her plea is bona fide, the Court should ordinarily lean in favour of granting transfer to ensure that access to justice is not denied.

In the present case, sufficient cause has been made out by the petitioner-wife. The hardship pleaded by her appears to be genuine and not merely a pretext to avoid proceedings. The distance involved, coupled with her lack of independent means and support, would undoubtedly make it difficult for her to effectively participate in the proceedings if they continue at the present forum.

Accordingly, in the interest of justice and to ensure a fair opportunity to both parties, the transfer petition is allowed. The matrimonial case pending before the existing Family Court is hereby ordered to be transferred to a competent Family Court having jurisdiction over the place where the petitioner-wife currently resides. The transferor court is directed to transmit the entire record of the case to the transferee court without delay so that the proceedings may continue expeditiously in accordance with law.

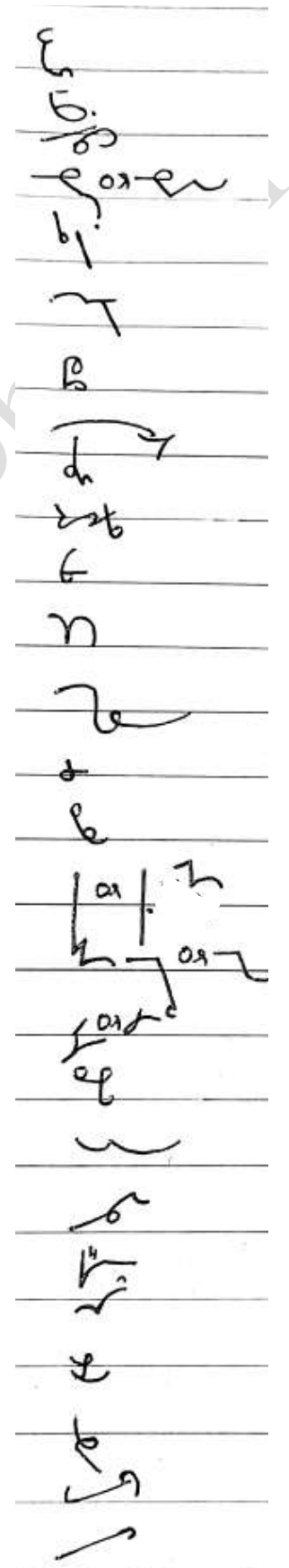

In matrimonial disputes, courts have consistently emphasized the importance of attempting reconciliation before proceeding with adjudication. In the present matter, such an approach was duly adopted when the parties were referred to the Mediation Centre with the hope that an amicable resolution could be reached. Mediation, as an alternative dispute resolution mechanism, plays a vital role in preserving relationships and minimizing the emotional strain often associated with matrimonial litigation. Accordingly, both parties were directed to appear before the Mediation Centre on a scheduled date and time.

Pursuant to the said direction, the parties appeared before the learned Mediator and participated in the mediation process. Despite sincere efforts made during the sessions and the willingness of the parties to engage in dialogue, no mutually acceptable settlement could be arrived at. The mediation proceedings were therefore concluded as unsuccessful, and the matter was placed back before this Court for further consideration.

Subsequently, the petitioner-wife has approached this Court by way of a transfer petition filed under Section 25 of the Code of Civil Procedure. The relief sought is the transfer of a matrimonial case instituted by the respondent-husband under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, seeking restitution of conjugal rights. The case is presently pending before a Family Court located in a different State, far removed from the place where the petitioner-wife is currently residing.

The petitioner-wife has urged several grounds in support of the transfer. It is contended that she is residing with her parents after the matrimonial discord and is dependent upon them for her livelihood. The financial constraints faced by her make it extremely difficult to undertake repeated travel to the court where the proceedings are presently pending. It has also been highlighted that the petitioner is required to travel alone over long distances, which poses safety concerns and adds to her physical and mental hardship. Furthermore, it is submitted that attending court proceedings at such a distant place would disrupt her daily life and impose an undue burden upon her.

The respondent-husband, however, has opposed the prayer for transfer, asserting that the petition lacks

merit and is intended to harass him. It is contended that he would suffer inconvenience if the case is transferred to another State and that the petitioner's claims of hardship are exaggerated.

This Court has carefully considered the rival submissions advanced by the parties. It is well settled that in matrimonial matters, especially those involving transfer petitions, the Court must adopt a pragmatic and humane approach. The convenience of the wife, particularly when she is not financially independent and is residing separately, deserves special consideration. The object of transfer jurisdiction is to ensure that justice is accessible and not rendered illusory due to practical difficulties faced by a litigant.

Upon evaluating the facts of the present case, this Court finds that the petitioner-wife has established sufficient cause warranting transfer of the proceedings. The distance between the two locations, coupled with her financial dependence and lack of support, constitutes a genuine hardship. Denial of transfer in such circumstances would effectively hinder her ability to participate in the proceedings and defend her case.

In view of the foregoing, the transfer petition is allowed. The matrimonial case pending before the current Family Court shall stand transferred to a competent Family Court within the jurisdiction where the petitioner-wife resides. The transferor court is directed to promptly transmit all records pertaining to the case to the transferee court. The transferee court shall proceed with the matter in accordance with law and endeavour to dispose of the same expeditiously. **Total Words:591**

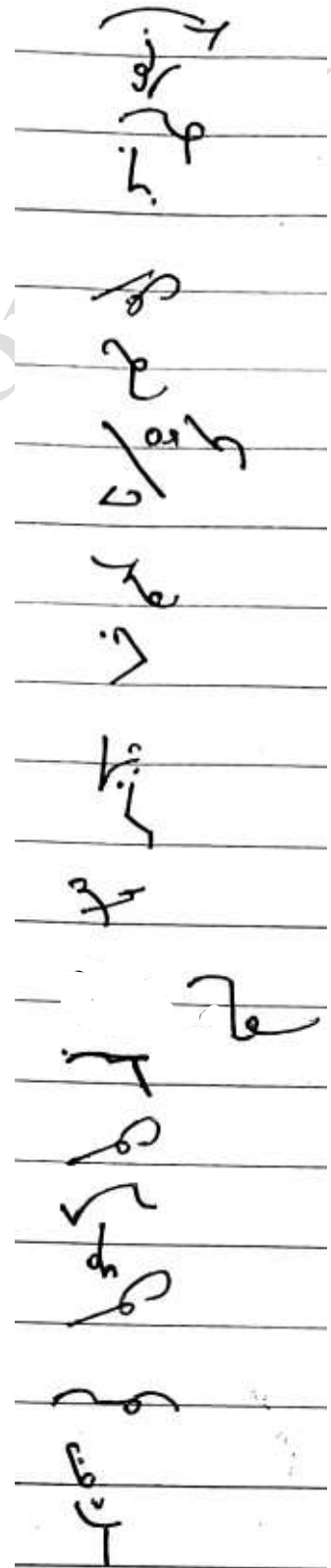
